Dear past, present and future British Ceramic Biennial volunteers,

We are currently looking for 50 volunteers to help us deliver the sixth British Ceramics Biennial festival, which is taking place in Stoke-on-Trent this year.

The five-week long festival presents work from the UK's leading contemporary ceramic artists in a series of new exhibitions and special events in the city, embracing the heritage of Stoke-on-Trent as the home of British ceramics.

A team of dedicated people is needed to help us deliver an exciting programme of exhibition and events, from 7th September – 13th October 2019. It is a unique opportunity for volunteers to get behind the scenes of a major festival and work alongside some of the leading figures in contemporary ceramics and socially-engaged art.

Volunteers will mainly be based at the former Spode factory in Elenora Street, Stoke. This historic building will be the main 'hub' of the festival and volunteers will have the opportunity to have a tour around the site and the exhibitions being shown.

As a volunteer you can expect:

- Flexible range of volunteering hours (weekdays, evenings and weekends to accommodate the availability for individuals)
 - Shifts will be split into four hour sessions
- Training and reasonable travel expenses provided.
- Professional references will be supplied to all successful students once the festival is finished
- The experience of volunteering at the BCB can be used as part of students' professional development credits at university whether studying Art, Design, Events or Tourism.
