

Volunteer Invigilation and Exhibitions Role BCB 2019 Festival

Supporting the 2019 British Ceramics Biennial's Exhibitions team.

# Background

The British Ceramics Biennial is the premier event in the UK's ceramics calendar. In 2019, the festival will take place in Stoke-on-Trent between 7<sup>th</sup> September and 13<sup>th</sup> October. Across this 5-week period, we expect over 70,000 to visit the British Ceramics Biennial across its four sites: Spode Works, World of Wedgwood, Middleport Pottery, The Potteries Museum and Art Gallery. Visitors will view new commissions from UK artists at the forefront of contemporary UK ceramics, experience work by artists-in-residence from India and Korea and have fun exploring clay themselves in The Clay Quarter, our messy and experimental engagement space.

## Role

Invigilation is a public facing role whereby volunteers have the opportunity to share valuable information about the artwork, the artists and the festival with our audiences. This is a chance to inspire the BCB audience and help them better understand and interpret the artwork, festival and Stoke-on-Trent better if they don't already know. The BCB exhibitions team will support Invigilation volunteers with in-depth and guided tours of the exhibits which will provide volunteers with knowledge and stories so they can better share and speak with the wider audience.

The role involves:

- Meeting and greeting the public
- · Answer queries about the artworks and exhibitions
- Weekly exhibition maintenance
- Monitoring daily visitor numbers
- Working with the Exhibitions and Curatorial team
